■ Number of Awards:	4
■ Application Deadline:	February 14, 2020
■ Grant Description:	Internships available for U.S. students at the ENEL Foundation in Rome. Duties will include support to EF senior researchers in their research activities and specific projects, 30 hours per week.
■ Grant Period:	3 months: May – July, 2020. SAEG grantees will be required to participate in a one-to-two days Fulbright Meeting organized by the Fulbright Commission in June.
■ Candidate Profile:	<p>Candidates at all degree levels (Bachelor's degree or masters' and doctoral candidates) with specific interest in Electricity, Energy transition and Climate mitigation.</p> <p>Applicants should have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • at least two years of studies in the electricity sector in technical or policy or financial or legal fields; • knowledge of energy technologies or markets, or policies or stakeholder's engagement; • ability to analyze complex information and dossiers from a wide range of scientific disciplines, and to prepare drafts of scientific opinions and reports; • experience in publishing and peer reviewing scientific work and publications. <p>Soft skills: Excellent communication skills and being team player.</p>
■ Affiliation:	<p>ENEL Foundation, Rome.</p> <p>ENEL Foundation is a non-profit organization focusing on the crucial role of clean energy to ensure a sustainable future for all. By developing partnerships with pre-eminent experts and institution across the globe, leveraging on the vast knowledge of its Founders, the Foundation conducts research to explore the implications of global challenges in the energy domain and offers education programs to the benefit of talents in the scientific, business and institutional realms.</p>
■ Language Requirement:	The internship will be in English. Conversational Italian language to facilitate interaction within the local community is recommended but not mandatory. Additional UN official language other than English will be considered a plus.
■ Grant Benefits:	The grant amounts to \$6.500. This sum includes a maintenance allowance of \$4.500, a settling-in allowance of \$900, and a travel allowance of \$1.100 to cover a round-trip ticket.
■ Health Insurance	During their stay in Italy, interns will benefit of supplemental health and accident insurance stipulated by the Commission. The validity of the coverage will be the exact grant period and will be applicable only in Italy. This insurance is not intended to replace the grantee's normal insurance policy, which should be maintained during the grant period.
■ Housing	Interns are responsible for securing housing for the period they will spend in Italy. The Commission recommends defining the search for an accommodation upon arrival in Italy and not from the U.S.
■ Dependents:	The SAEG Internship program does not support dependents or family members. Candidates may not have any dependents accompany them for

	any time during the program.
